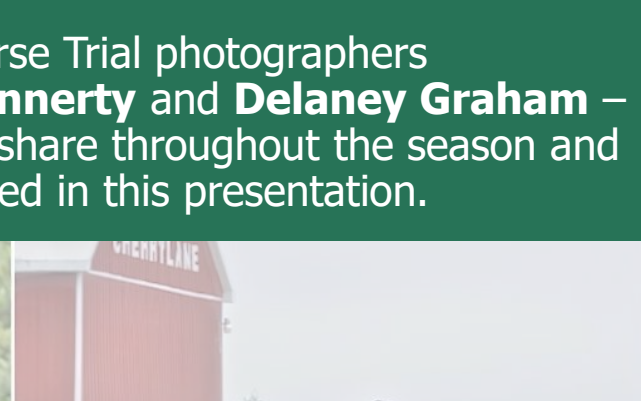
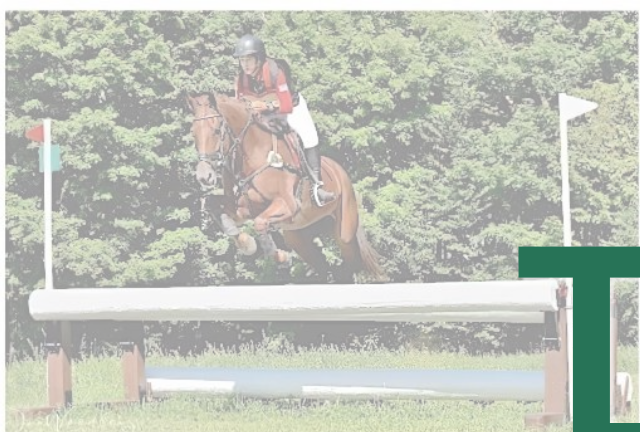

We have a lot to be thankful for:

- ✓ **Venue numbers** are stable at 9.
- ✓ **Horse Trial numbers** are healthy although we have lost a sanctioned HT each year since 2023.
- ✓ **FEI** has returned to Ontario with 2 competitions in 2025 and 2 put forward for approval in 2026.
- ✓ **New levels** being added all the time, including at the EV60, EV105, and EV115 levels.
- ✓ **Membership numbers** down slightly but stable.
- ✓ **Entries are up**, despite being down one HT from 2024.

★ Overall decline in entries from 2023 to 2024 shows signs of recovery, notably in EV75, EV90 and EV115. EV60 also remained strong and added 2 runs. There was one fewer EV110 run in 2025 than in 2024.

Breakdown by Sanctioning Level, 2023-2025

In 2025 Bronze levels represented roughly **72%** of entries at HTs in Ontario, Silver levels roughly **16.5%**, Gold levels roughly **10%**, and FEI **1.5%**; an almost identical breakdown as in both 2023 & 2024.

- **Bronze:** EV60 is having a positive impact on EV75, which has turned around since 2024. Some attrition/decline in EV85.
- **Silver:** EV100 reversed decline and grew by 15.5% from 2024. EV105 down 14%; net loss of 1 HT in 2025.
- **Gold:** Riders at the EV110 level (and 2*) declined by about 10% but EV115 offered at 4 HTs, recovered to over 2023 levels and increased by 50% from 2024 to 2025.

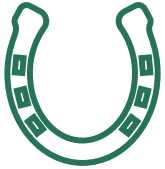
- > **Juniors:** the number of Juniors has turned around since 2023-2024 when the number went **down by 7.7%** to 2024-2025 that saw the number of Juniors go **up by 10.7%**.
- > **Adults:** the rate of decline of Adult memberships has slowed since **2023-2024 which saw a drop of 7.2%**. Between **2024 and 2025 Adult memberships fell by 4.9%**.
- > **Overall:** the rate of decline in overall memberships has slowed from **-8.6%** from 2023-2024 to **-4.9%** from 2024-2025.

Issues



SUPPORT MEMBERS AT ALL LEVELS: Numbers and Experiences

- › Work to reverse the albeit slowed decline in membership; maintain strong numbers among Juniors and strengthen numbers and experiences for Adult Riders.
- › Maintain entries at sustainable levels (from grassroots to HP) with a view to increasing numbers over time; there are no EC sanctioned HTs without Bronze riders and there are no Olympians without HP.
- › Where possible optimize opportunities to show member appreciation and encourage education.



ENCOURAGE DEVELOPMENT: Grassroots and beyond

- › Continue to encourage riders at EV60 as well as those working their way through the levels, including a strong cohort of U25s.
- › Work with our horse-sport partners and other stakeholders to ensure that governance structures support Eventing and do not erect barriers.



SUPPORT COMPETITIONS AND HORSE TRIAL ORGANIZERS

- › Continue to support existing HT Organizers and look for new venues.
- › While most entries are Bronze, continue to support Silver & Gold HTs, which are vital for Ontario's Eventers including those who wish to find a path to HP.
- › Work with Organizers to develop a HT calendar that optimizes entries for everyone.



BUILD COMMUNICATIONS

- › Develop clear messages for our members about who we are and what we do and our relationship with our horse-sport partners and other stakeholders.
- › Take all opportunities to communicate with our members.
- › With new Directors in place, build Strategic Plan (2025-2030) for release in January 2026.

Adult Riders

In real terms, the number of adult riders continues to fall, although the rate of decline has slowed from 2024 to 2025.

- In 2024 we introduced an **Adult Rider Team Challenge** to encourage camaraderie and team-building & strengthen a sense of shared experience among riders who might ride, school, and event on their own.
- In 2025, with the **Bradley Mark Johnston Educational Foundation**, we introduced two **bursaries** directed at our members over 18, to help adult riders and working students. These ran as pilot projects in 2025 and we will work with the Foundation to determine their viability for 2026 and beyond.
- We will work in 2026 to continue to develop dedicated programming to support adult riders, build community and promote education.



In 2025, adult riders made up 58% of the OEA's total membership.

They are the backbone of our competitive membership who show up week-in and week-out throughout the season.

Bradley Mark Johnston Pursuit of Excellence Bursary

- To encourage advancement in education for aspiring amateurs or professionals in the horse industry, specializing in Eventing.
- The **Bradley Mark Johnston Educational Foundation** awards \$4,000 to serve as a bridge to educational resources that might otherwise be out of reach.

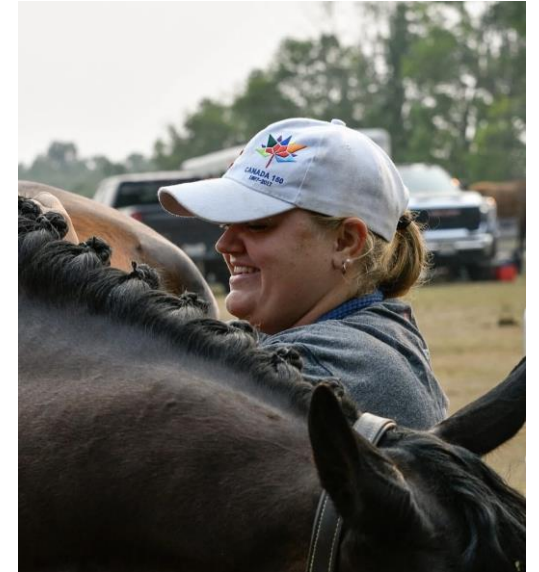

Clinics

A key avenue for delivering educational experiences to our members

Boyd Martin

- On November 3, 2024, the OEA welcomed Boyd Martin to Ontario for his first-ever Canadian clinic.
- Accommodated **25 riders** (including **9 U25** riders) and close to 50 auditors.
- To extend the reach of the clinic, members of the U25 Program, along with coaches, were invited to audit for free.
- Following the clinic, Sam Pritchard, captured the essence of some of the key lessons from the day, which we shared widely with our members on social media and the website.

Lucinda Green

- > On April 29 & 30, 2025, the OEA partnered with Glen Oro Farm to welcome Lucinda Green back to Ontario to teach a 'Masterclass' designed as much for coaches as for competitors. Over the 2 days, we accommodated:



16 riders. Day 1 in-ring exercises; Day 2 XC course.



26 coaches. On course and 'classroom' time. Coaches came from across Canada.



100+ registered auditors & 7 U25 riders who came for free.

Peter Gray

In 2025, the OEA offered two clinics with Ontario's own Peter Gray, Olympic eventer, Pan Am Games Bronze Medalist, Grand Prix dressage rider & FEI dressage judge.

- July 1, 2025 accommodated 9 riders and 6 auditors at the dressage clinic "Ride Through the Judge's Eyes".
- August 5-6, 2025, accommodated 23 riders at two days of intensive training for Eventers at Ottawa's Wesley Clover Parks, focusing on stadium jumping (day one) and cross-country schooling (day two).

- High numbers of EV60 riders translate into higher numbers of EV75 riders.
- Growth in **EV60 2023-2025: +35%**. Growth in **EV75 2023-2025: +5%** (2024-2025 was 17%).
- The OEA waived its Day Membership fee for EV60 again in 2025.
- Consider revisiting EV60 Guidelines to see how we can optimize every opportunity to introduce riders to Eventing in beginner-friendly way yet continue to support nationally sanctioned Eventing.

OEA Development Days

Previously “Schooling Days” to encourage new riders to try Eventing by offering safe and affordable XC schooling with licensed coaches.

- Riders from other disciplines, or individuals returning to riding, are welcome.
- Builds awareness of, and gives coaches and riders exposure to, Horse Trial venues.
- In 2025, the OEA hosted three Development Days, one each at Stevens Creek, Glenarden and Caledon.
- Ran 3 Development Days in 2025 (up from 2 Schooling Days in 2024) and attracted 73 riders.



EV105 – Modified level

A vital division for preparing horses and riders for upper-level Eventing by promoting them safely through to the higher divisions.

- In 2025 Ontario's organizers offered EV105 at **5** horse trials at three different venues, down from 7 horse trials at three venues in 2024.
- With the retirement of Bronte Creek from the calendar at the end of 2024, Ontario lost 3 horse trials that ran EV105.
- In 2025 Cherrylane offered EV105 at their August HT, so with the 2 each at WCP and Wit's End.
- 2026 may see further changes. Both Ontario FEIs will continue to run a 1* which bodes well for interest in EV105 as the entry level to FEI.



OEA's U25 Program



Encouraging Ontario riders aged 25 and under to explore a pathway to high performance.

- The OEA's U25 Program is one of the largest in the country with 40 members in 2025.
- 100% self-financed through registration fees, fundraising by the U25 riders, and the generous support of sponsors.
- Focus on rider education, training, sportsmanship, and fellowship within a framework that promotes safety and best practices.
- Participation, for riders who qualified, in the North American Youth Championships (Eventing) under the guidance of *Chef d'Equipe* Kendal Lehari.
- **Travel and Training Grants:** As of October 31 2025, 4 travel and training grants have been awards for a total of \$2,400.

Cooperation with Horse-Sport Partners

Supporting active collaboration with our Horse-Sport partners

The OEA has a mandate to support nationally sanctioned eventing in Ontario. To do this, as Ontario's Provincial Horse Trial Association (PHTA), we have regular meetings with Equestrian Canada (EC), which sanctions the network of national Horse Trials throughout Canada. We are by far the largest PHTA in Canada and we work in cooperation with EC and the other PHTAs to maintain the health of Eventing in our own province and nationwide.

- **EC Levies:** With the support of our Organizers, the OEA has succeeded in ensuring that a portion of the EC levies paid by our members on entries at each HT will be returned to support Ontario venues and Horse Trials.
- **EC Rule Changes:** We will pursue opportunities to work with our Organizers on issues where specific rules changes could contribute to making a positive contribution to Eventing in Ontario.



Supporting Competitions and Organizers

Competition Improvement Program (CIP)

THE CORE OF OEA'S SUPPORT FOR HORSE TRIAL ORGANIZERS

- Supporting Organizers and venues was a 'high priority' for **92%** of the survey respondents who urged keeping funding for XC courses and infrastructure improvements (stadium jumping and warm up areas).
- In **2025, close to 70% of all membership fees and levies**, were paid directly back to our HT Organizers through the CIP & TD Reimbursement Program, to support annual costs associated with the development/improvement of venues.
- CIP allows for reimbursable expenses for XC & stadium course design.
- Safety was a high priority for **78%** of survey respondents and CIP provisions supporting the purchase and installation of frangible devices will remain.
- There were no changes to the CIP in 2025 but it may be opened up in 2026 so that we meet any changing expectations of Organizers and expectations of Members as expressed in the survey responses.
- TD reimbursements paid out in **2025 were \$7,100.**



Officials/Rules

- Helping ensure a **sustainable supply of trained officials** to support the future of Eventing in Ontario.
- **Reviewing, annual rule changes from EC** and, from time to time, proposing new rules or amendments to existing rules to enhance safety in Eventing for both horses and riders.

OFFICIALS' BURSARY

- The OEA sponsors an Officials Bursary to help officials and would-be officials maintain or upgrade their status, continue their education and support ongoing education.
- Total claims in 2025: \$4,900 (up from \$1,000 in 2024)
- Popular program in 2025; the fund was exhausted before the end of June helping send members to EC's Officials' Workshops.
- Update the website and criteria for 2026.



Volunteers

The OEA is committed to support our organizers and competitors by facilitating the flow of qualified volunteers to Ontario Horse Trials.

Anyone who's worked with an Organizer understands the epic task of delivering a sanctioned HT and the number of bodies needed to run them safely. Our members appreciate this. Promoting volunteerism was identified as a 'high priority' for **75%** of survey respondents.

- **Communication:** rally volunteers on social media and WhatsApp to help Organizers with last-minute requests to fill key personnel roles for Horse Trials.
- **Incentive:** An OEA-branded YETI travel mug was offered to Organizers to raffle off at each HT in 2024 & 2025. To date, 39 mugs have been awarded to Ontario volunteers, and it has been a popular initiative. This Incentive measure will be reviewed and revisited for 2026.

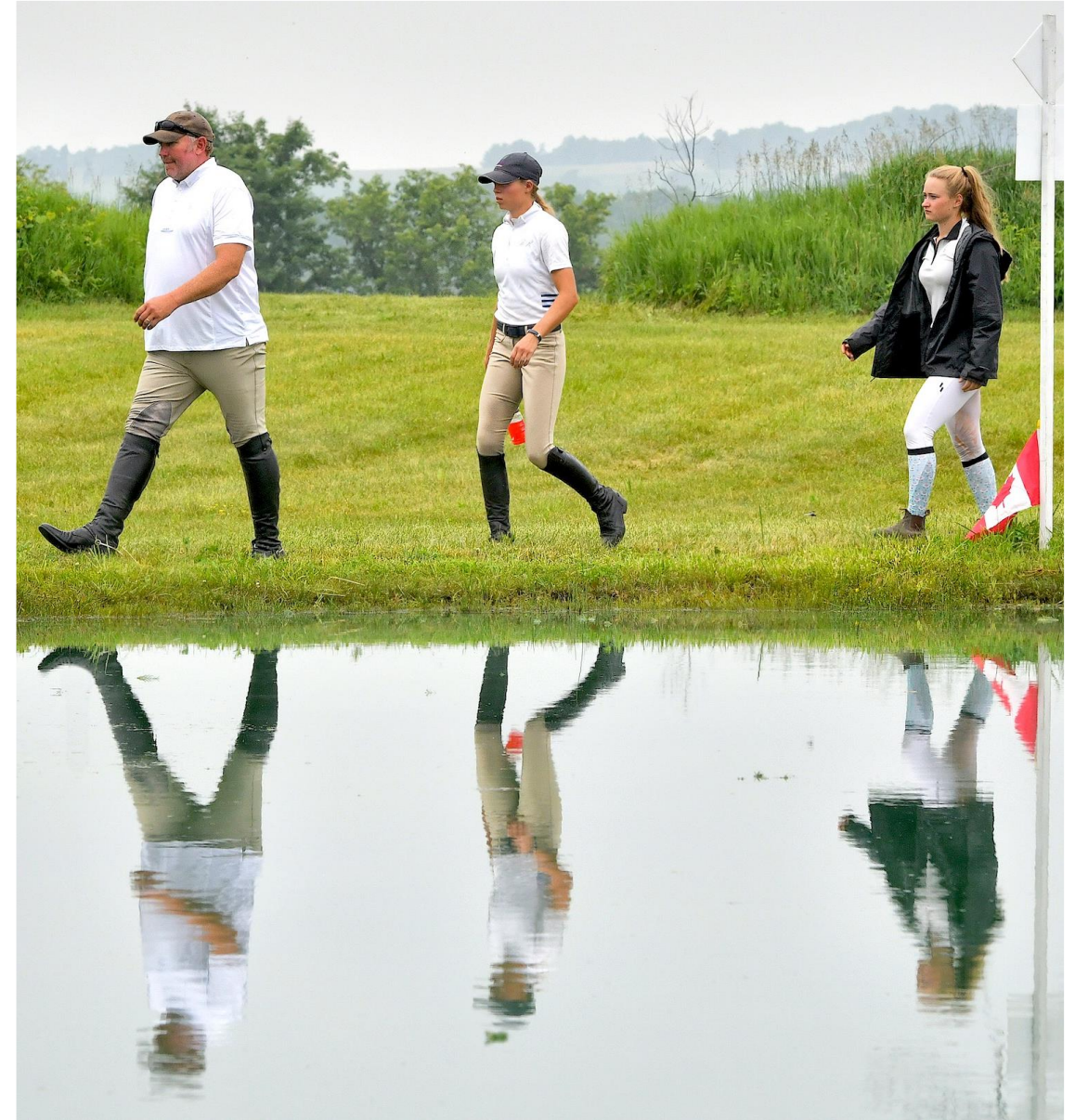
